Current high school students have competed at state culinary competitions. Others have built an energy efficient home that was featured on the cover of a national magazine. Local students have taken first, second and honorable mention awards at this year's state science fair. One student has developed a prototype for an innovative jet engine propeller that is being given national attention by the aeronautics industry.

This generation of young people will find the cure for cancer, solve the world's hunger problems and develop cost effective ways to meet the energy demands of an ever growing population. Yes, these students are from Humboldt County. The community is working very hard to ensure all students are successful so they can be contributing members in our society and economy. It's important work and there is much that needs to be done.
