

COMMUNITY COMMENT FOR AUGUST 28, 2013

After listening to John Whitehead in his interview with Governor Mike Huckabee recently about Gun Control and unbelievable stories about overzealous authorities, in raiding the houses of people, I thought that I should expand on that subject.

Mr. Whitehead told the story of a mayor of a small town who was attacked by police officers in his home. They shot his two dogs, handcuffed him, threw him on the floor and then discovered they had the wrong house, but only after they had broken down his front door. Then I read an article about how a Facebook photo that a New Jersey father posted of his son holding a 22 Calibre semi automatic rifle resulted in a visit and attempted home search by police and their New Jersey Department of Youth and Family Services. Here is what happened at Mr. Moore's house.

Without a search warrant the New Jersey Department of Youth and Family services came to the Moore Home accompanied by Police Officers. They claimed to be responding to a call about a photo of a young boy holding a firearm.

Without a search warrant, this agency demanded entry into the Moore home and access to all of his firearms. Moore was not initially there but his wife called him. With his lawyer listening to the exchange on the Phone with Police and this agency, Moore denied entry to his home and access to his safe where he stored his guns. When Moore requested the name of the agency representative, she refused to give it to him. After threatening to take my kids, Mr. Moore said, the police and the Family Services Worker left, empty handed and seeing nothing. Fortunately, and rightly, it has now been announced that no charges will be filed against Mr. Moore. Still, the event was outrageous and unfortunate.

Mr. Whitehead went on to say, in this interview that his investigation has established that there are Swat Teams in the Federal Department of Education, the IRS and many other agencies.

So, I ask the question, why do these agencies need Swat Teams? As you know the agenda today in Texas, California and many other states, is to bad guns all together.

I leave you with a point to ponder. When the home intruder with a stolen weapon breaks into your home won't you be glad that you had the necessary tools to defend yourself and your family.
