I belong to the Eel River Early Birds in Fortuna. We meet at 7 a.m. on Mondays at City Hall. Between the two clubs in Eureka there is a Noon meeting every Thursday at the Prosperity Center on E Street.

I had always been curious about Toastmasters. I enjoy public speaking but I thought if I went to a Toastmasters meeting I would speak in front of a group of people that would tear apart every sentence, criticize every motion and inflection, and basically tell me how bad I was.

My thoughts could not have been further from the reality of Toastmasters. I walked in to a nurturing environment and was gently guided to improving my speaking techniques. There are no instructors in Toastmasters, your growth and improvement come from feedback and practice.

Impromptu speaking, or speaking off-the-cuff, is my weakest skill. Toastmasters has "Table Topics" at each meeting and it helps keep me as ready as I can be for those situations. Usually when I'm called on out of the blue to make a statement my head will swim, my mind goes anywhere and everywhere except to the topic at hand. When I'm done I will wonder "why didn't I remember to say what I meant to say!"

Practicing with table topics at Toastmasters has helped me tremendously in that area.

There are even positive side benefits to becoming a Toastmaster member. You gain leadership skills, become a better listener, and increase self-confidence.

In the last few years Toastmasters International has revitalized its education program and renewed its focus on leadership and modernized its communication program.

Their current goals are:

*To provide tailored learning to help members meet personal and professional goals

*Create communication and leadership skills relevant to real-world experiences in a globally evolving marketplace

*Construct a clearer path for achieving education awards
