A small increase in the sales tax is a rather painless way of raising funds. Chief Woods of the Humboldt (Formerly Eureka) Fire Department, said on KINS that one station would be closed down and several fierfighters would be laid off. That, I think, is unacceptable. Same thing with the Police Department. Given the number of buildings in Eureka and the number of areas that are firesusceptable, we need a full force and the same with the police

department, given the number of people running around out there who are causing most of the problems, with their probability of needing police attention.
