It's also a time of reflection on the year that has been and the year yet to come (a rather Dickinsonian way to put it I suppose.)

This past year the Fortuna Chamber of Commerce celebrated many new businesses opening in town – Humboldt Threads, Real Food Grocer Café, Rare Bird, The Learning Place, Thrive Wellness, Lightning Boom Productions and more. We celebrated new locations for Dorris & Daughter Catering, Humboldt Fence Company, HealthSport and Cornerstone Realty.

And there was a lot of collaborations happening in town between the City, McLean Foundation, Chamber, and Humboldt Lodging Alliance. Two prime examples of exceptional partnerships are the funding of an Economic Development Coordinator for the City and a River Lodge Sales and Marketing Coordinator.
