This is Anthony Mantova for Community Comment.

Last time we talked it was about doing business in Eureka. Not an easy thing to do when you consider the out-of-control homeless problem.

My brothers and I have learned to cope with it. Operating a business in Old Town. We have become experts at turning away crazy people at the door. Expert tacticians at de-esculating potential conflicts, I believe it's true to say that we deal with the homeless an average of once a day.

The homeless problem has surpassed critical mass in Eureka. As someone on the front lines, I can provide some perspective that I haven't heard anyone say. When it comes to Old Town businesses, truly are on our own.

The 1st term ill share, is what we call "orbiting," Every day, our local food shelters feed the homeless. Unfortunately many of these homeless have severe addictions to meth or heroin, and they have no desire to change their way of life. By feeding these people without any expectation of change, our soup kitchens and homeless advocates are creating a condition of orbitting, ensuring that drug addled homeless spend their days walking within a one mile circle, an orbit that spreads crime, scares tourists and lures visiting hobos into a life of crime.

Another term we use around here, is "Pseudo Hobo," which means someone that has a place to live, but chooses to live the hobo lifestyle. I know a hobo named Allen, he recently moved here from New York. He decided that the welfare and handouts were so good, that he found a way ti make a living. He found a flaw in the system that says you can get extra money if you live in a van. Armed with this discovery he went back to New York to bring back a van he happens to own! Now he can live off our tax dollars in the comfort of his own van! That is what w call a Pseudo Hobo--and yes, he get a free meal next door.

We, Merchants can do more. All businesses in Old Town should figure out what it would cost to hire a private security company to boost our security. Publicly on social media, merchants should share and document the daily abuses that take place, thats a great way to keep the issue front and center.

Hobos that visit us for the first time often do it because Humboldt comes up in Google searches as a great place for handouts and compassion. Our Chamber of Commerce needs to hire somebody to lower our SEO ranking on these online searches. The chamber should also provide a "Live Exit Poll" of outgoing tourists and document just how much revernue we lose to scared tourists. I bet the numbers would startle you!

Finally, the City Council. They come across as clueless about what to do. A good start would be acknowleding the problem. As it stands, anyone watching the council would assume they value Eureka's bums more than it's businesses. Show some leadership, because no where does it say Eureka is tasked with accomodating folks that want to live lawless lives on my dime.
