We have the freeloaders who are sucking the welfare system dry and taking every thing they can get hold of, begging on street corners, and some, I suspect, stealing what they can, but they are not who I am talking about today.//One bunch is those who have vehicles that are not running, and instead of taking them to a wrecking yard, they abandon them on a neighborhood street, and leave it up to the residents to call the police, or otherwise get them hauled off at someone else's expense. \$20,000 to get him out". "You mean Charlie? was her response. "Yeah, Charlie" he said. She arranged to have it sent, then they called back and said they needed another \$27,000 to fix it. She arranged to have her bank send it. This lady is a very nice, intelligent lady who just wan't thinking! I certainly would change banks if that happened to me-God Forbid! First, I'm sure my grandkids wouldn't that, and if they did, they might be some time in a Mexican jail! I have a general Idea where my grandkids are, but, you never can tell.//Another scam that's going around is a call from someone claiming they are with the IRS and if you don't pay up or check with them they will prosecute you.
