It's easy to get caught up in the national dramas that plays out on the mainstream news. If you tune in, you'll be introduced to never-ending stories of Russian election collusion, fake Trump scandals and of course: whether or not the President properly condemned the domestic terroris

I'm not here to talk about any of that, because none of it matters. None of it impacts your life, because it is all #FakeNews.

When you look at the official, hard data - The United States is turning things around and, thanks to Trump, we are starting to seeing the statistics to prove it.

America's unemployment rate is 4.3 percent, the lowest point in 10 years. And that matters, because the rate was more than double in 2011.

The quarterly GDP growth of 2.6% came as a surprise to many analysts, and it is likely to widen later this year.

leadership that is not concerned with growth. The states direct democracy has backfired in a big way, layering bad propositions in the voting booth on top of the legions of bad laws written in Sacramento.

Most of the costs of living in this state are artificial, meaning that they are man-made. For example, California has the worst income tax rate in the country. Even worse than New York and New Jersey. While not quite the worst, the sales tax and corporate taxes are very high as well. And of course in California, the excise tax is 35 cents of every gallon of gas at the pump.

The leadership doesn't get any better locally. We have a city council that has no clue how to handle the homeless problem that plaques Eureka.

So my point is, don't let the mainstream news get you worked up. The country is doing just fine. But do be concerned with our state and local situation. And if you are running a business, double the amount of concern and try to focus on fixing the challenges that actually effect your life. It is too easy to get distracted.
