Are we making it too difficult to be a Council person? It's not just sitting at the dais two Mondays a month. There are special meetings, County meetings and Regional meetings. There are reports to read and preparation for all of those meetings.

This isn't to dissuade people from running—actually, I'm hoping that it will persuade people to run. It's the ultimate community engagement.

We need strong leaders in our community who will continue to stand up for Fortuna in a county that sometimes treats us as an afterthought. Case in point—the County Planning Department that has been eager to approve Cannabis permits on land that is adjacent to our City limits—next to neighborhoods and ball fields
