I have commented many times in the past from articles in the magazine called verdict published by judicial watch. In its June 2018 issue it has several wonderful articles but the one that caught my attention was about the city of Baltimore which has the highest per capita murder rate has now just created a defense fund for ill legal aliens.

The article says that less than a year after Baltimore prosecutors ordered staff not to charge illegal immigrants with minor nonviolent crimes because it could get the offenders deported. Maryland's largest city will hire immigration attorneys to help those facing removal. Baltimore has the nation's highest per capita homicide rate and has been coined the deadliest big city in the United States by a mainstream newspaper. Nevertheless a city panel approved spending \$200,000 to pay for lawyers to represent ill legal aliens with deportation orders.

The trend of using taxpayer dollars to assist illegal aliens in deportation proceedings all started under the Obama administration. As an example, the Chicago city Council led the way by creating a \$1.3 million legal defense fund and Los Angeles followed with a \$10 million defense fund to help illegal immigrants Dodge justice. Shortly thereafter the Los Angeles County board of supervisors offered to kick in another \$3 million to provide more lawyers for these ill legal aliens.

According to this article Baltimore took it a step further by creating a policy to go easy on alien criminals in state cases to avert collateral immigration consequences. Baltimore's chief deputy state's attorney instructed prosecutors to think twice before charging illegal immigrants with minor nonviolent crimes. Besides Baltimore, two other Maryland counties Montgomery and Prince George offer illegal immigrants sanctuary.

~~During this year the Maryland legislators tried to pass a measure to make the state an official illegal alien sanctuary but the bill, known as the trust act <sup>hit a</sup> roadblock in a Senate committee after passing in the house of delegates. Maryland's governor has vowed to veto it even if it survives.~~

according to this article the Tromp administration is not supporting the conduct of these states and cities as it pertains to illegal aliens as illegal aliens mean that these people are here illegally. Having traveled in Europe in years past I know what happens to you if you cross into a country without a passport or a license for entry into that country. We should be just as responsive as those European countries are.

In 2015 Pres. Obama allocated \$2 million of our tax dollars to hire attorneys to represent the influx of illegal alien minors in federal immigration proceedings. At some point this has to stop.
